Felix Starts Something

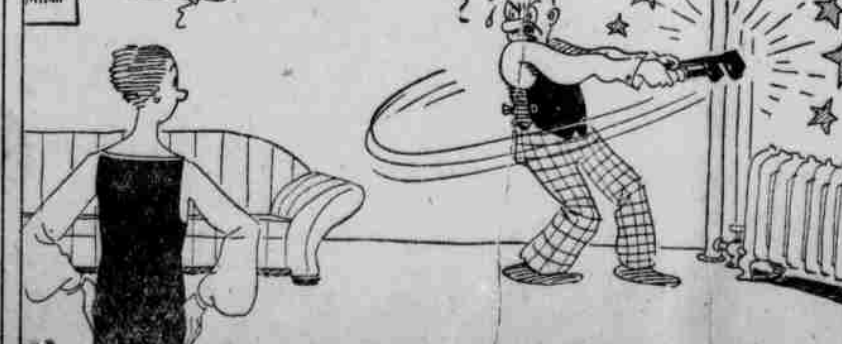
YESTERDAY FELIX FEATHERHEAD DISCOVERED WHY THE PLASTER ALL FELL OFF THE CEILING.
