Mr. and Mrs. J. M. Morton of Raleigh were at Harlowe Sunday visiting Mrs. W. W. Chadwick.

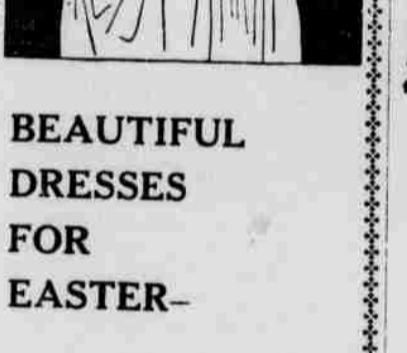

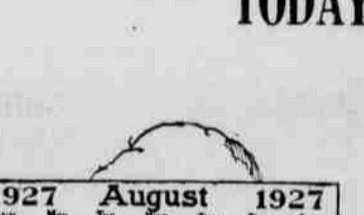
