### Rides Four Winners in Day

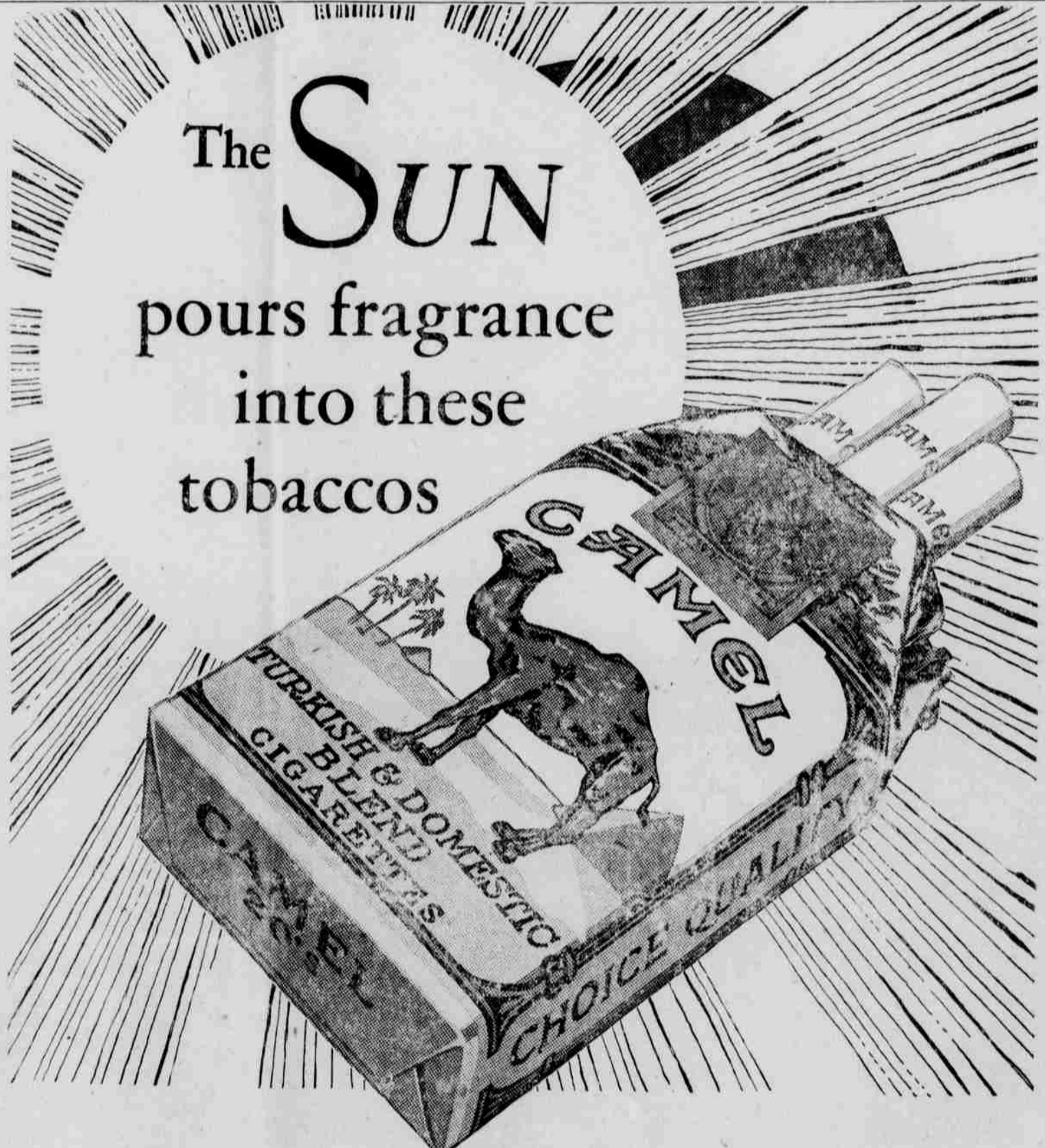


Jockey A. Robertson, diminutive
