**Resolution Adopted To Drop County Cases**

It was the intention of the News to publish in last week's issue the resolution in regard to the county cases which was adopted by the board of county commissioners on the first Monday. There was only one copy of the resolution available and the News could not get hold of that until too late to get it in our issue of the 10th. As it may be of considerable interest to the public it is presented herewith:

**Resolution**

WHEREAS, on the first Monday in December, 1930, at the time the present Board of Commissioners of Carteret County assumed responsibility of their office, there were pending in the Superior Court of Carteret County Civil actions brought and instituted by the former or predecessor Board of Commissioners in the name of Carteret County against certain former officials, and others, and which cases were, and now are, captioned: "Carteret County vs. W. L. Stancil and G. W. Huntley;" "Carteret County vs. Simmons Construction Corporation, et al;" "Carteret County vs. George J. Brooks and C. K. Howe, et al," and "Carteret County vs. Luther Hamilton." and

WHEREAS, the present Board of Commissioners through advice of counsel representing Carteret County petitioned the Governor of the State for a special term of court for the trial of the said County cases, and after a two weeks session of the court devoted exclusively to the trial of the said cases each of the said cases was terminated adversely to the interest of the County and at great expense

to the County; and WHEREAS, the County already has expended many thousands of dollars in the preparation for trial and the actual trial of the causes; and WHEREAS, it has been caused to appear to the satisfaction of the Board through intimations of the Trial Judge and through information other obtained during the progress of the suits that a further prosecution of the actions would entail and result in a considerably increased outlay of costs and expenses to the County, and without any reasonable hope or probability of the county's being able to make any recovery in the actions, or any one of them, or otherwise justify further procedure; and

WHEREAS, the financial affairs of the County are such as to require and demand on the part of this Board conservative measures in the interest of the tax-paying public, and the Board itself being altogether of the opinion that the said actions are without sufficient merit to justify further expenditures in their prosecution, and the Board thus far having cooperated with counsel representing the county in the said suits but without avail in the interests of the County:

NOW, THEREFORE, Be it Resolved, that counsel representing the county in the prosecution of the several actions, be and they hereby are, authorized and directed to desist from further prosecution and to take no other action of any kind in connection with the said suits, or either of them, in the name of Carteret County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be furnished by the Clerk of this Board, Messrs. McLendon & Hedrick of Durham, N. C., and Mr. Rodman Guion, New Bern, N. C. Mr. E. H. Gorham, of Morehead City, N. C. and Mr. E. W. Hill of Beaufort, N. C.
