



under. Cutting the stalks deprives the weevils of their food, and plowing the stalks under will kill weevils which

might otherwise survive the winter. If the stalks are left to grow until frost, the weevils will approach winter in a healthy, vigorous condition, Brannon added, and they will be well able to withstand the cold weather.

An ounce of prevention is worth several pounds of cure, he declared, and the destruction of boll weevils in fall and winter is one of the best control methods known.

Furthermore, he added, the quicker that the stalks can be cut and plowed under, the better is the chance of destroying most of the weevils.






