NEW FISHERIES RULES AND AMENDMENTS PASSED AT THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF THE DEPARTMENT CONSERVATION AND DEVELOPMENT AT RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA, JANUARY 22, 1936

COMMERCIAL FISHERIES RULES
20. (Amended) It shall be unlawful to set pound nets outside of a line beginning at Red Stone Point in Croatan Sound one-fifth the width of said Sound from the shore, and running northeast by north three-quarters north course to the Red Spar Buoy number four; a southwesterly course from Croatan Light house; thence to the Red Can Buoy off Carroon's Point; thence northwest by north three-quarters north 1150 yds. to a point 1400 yards from shore; thence northwest by north one-quarter north to a stake or buoy 2050 yards from the shore.

112. Repealed.
120. (Amended) It shall be unlawful to haul nets with power boats in Pamlico or Pungo Rivers above a line drawn from Cedar Island in the mouth of Oyster Creek to the flash light at Abel's Bay, or to haul nets with power boats in any of the tributaries of Pamlico or Pungo Rivers.


130. (Amended) It shall be unlawful to haul nets with power boats in Alligator River above a straight line drawn from Briery Point on the east side of said river to the north bank of the Little Alligator River on the west, or in any of the tributaries of Alligator River.

SHELLFISH RULES
5. (Amended) It shall be lawful for sail boats thirty-five feet in length and under to dredge oysters in Swan Quarter Narrows.
69. (Amended) It shall be unlawful to take or catch oysters with scoops, scrapers or dredges in the following described territories in Hyde County; Juniper Bay and Swan Quarter Bay.
79. It shall be lawful for sail boats thirty-five feet in length and under to dredge oysters in Rose Bay.
