Roland Longest pitched his fourth consecutive victory as Beaufort took the measure of the Lenoir-Jones County All-Stars here last Sunday 10 to 3. Longest has yet to suffer defeat.

Opportune hitting plus the six passes issued by Cardwell and four errors tells the story of the locals' eighth win in eleven starts this season. Brooks' two singles and a double that drove in four runs paced the 13 hit attack. Skarren's single and double knocked in three scores and R. Longest got two safeties to aid his cause.

The visitors scored one in each of the fourth, fifth and eighth when two hits in each inning sent the markers over. Adams and George got two apiece of the nine hits gathered by

the losers. Longest was accorded faultless support, Brooks at short especially featuring. Clark was the only local who failed to hit safely at least once.

Beaufort scored two in the first when Skarren singled to drive in Clark and Ralph Hassell both of whom had walked. F. Longest's hit and C. Hassell's double added one in the third. Four tallied in the fourth on singles by R. Longest, Brooks and Ralph Hassell. Skarren's two-bagger, a bunt by Willis and an error. R. Longest hit in the fifth and scored on Brooks' hit. The final pair were made in the seventh on a triple by Willis, a double by Brooks and a miscue.

Cardwell fanned 12 and Longest 6. Hill caught for the All-Stars and Ray Hassell for Beaufort.
