

**To Present Broadcast On Marketing Turkeys**

Raleigh Oct. 21—Getting his birds ready for the Thanksgiving and Christmas markets is one of the turkey grower's most important tasks, says T. T. Brown, extension poultryman at State College.

In a radio talk on the Carolina Farm Features program Friday, October 23, Mr. Brown will attempt to point out the most approved practices for feeding and handling the holiday birds.

"The job of raising turkeys is rather difficult even when the birds are given the best of care," declares Mr. Brown, "but when the grower becomes lax in his management and feeding, failure is almost sure to result."

Also to be included on the week's schedule will be a talk on saving farm woodlands which will be presented by R. W. Graeber, extension forester at State College, on the Saturday, October 24, broadcast.

"The rate at which our farm woodlands are being cut is alarming," declares Mr. Graeber, "and unless forestry practices are used by more growers, we may soon be faced with a timber shortage."

Raleigh, N. C., 12—Collections on rural rehabilitation loans made by the Resettlement Administration in this region are being in "satisfactory amounts," Regional Director George S. Mitchell said today.

The present rate of collection for the region—North Carolina, Tennessee, Kentucky, Virginia and West Virginia... is \$22,000 per day.

About 75 per cent of the daily collections thus far in the region has been from the early tobacco belt of North Carolina and Virginia. This

**Newspaper Editors Say F.D.R. Will Win**

New York, N. Y. Oct. 22—Franklin D. Roosevelt will most likely be re-elected to the Presidency, according to results of the third annual political poll taken among 5,145 newspaper editors by Liberty Magazine.

Liberty asked each editor who he thought would be elected President. About 400 editors turned this question down, leaving some 4,600 lined up as follows.

flow of loan repayments, routed directly into the general receipts of the United States treasury, is expected to be doubled as the season for marketing all cash crops advances, Mr. Mitchell stated. Most collections of installments due this year will be made over a period of about 100 days.

It was explained by the regional director that the policy during the past year was to make loans to qualified farm families for periods up to five years, first installments being due this fall. Loans in the five states to date total about \$7,439,000.

"A check-up reveals that in many tobacco belt counties repayments have already exceeded the installments due for the first year," Mr. Mitchell said. "In some instances, in the potato growing sections of North Carolina and Virginia, a good yield enabled to pay off their entire loans in one payment this year."
