It is not necessary for anyone to hire an agent to file a claim for him. Naturally the Board has to have some proof that the person filing a claim is entitled to the amount claimed, but the procedure has been made as simple and easy as possible and Field Offices of the Social Security Board will give full information and assistance to any person who believes he has a sum due and wishes to file a claim,"
