

Surplus Products Aided Many During Month Of October

There were 2,055 persons representing 469 families certified by welfare officials in Carteret coun-

ty eligible for receiving surplus commodities during October, according to statistics furnished this week by Arthur E. Langston, State Director of Commodity distribution with the State Board of Charities and Public Welfare.

Number of persons to receive commodities in nearby counties and especially from the area by the District Storeroom in New Bern follows:

Craven, 2,037 persons; Jones, 1,905; Lenoir, 1,875; New Hanover, 4,260; Onslow, 576; Paulio, 1,803; and Pender, 549. The total for the eight counties served by the New Bern storeroom was 15,058 persons which was more that the total number certified to receive suplus commodities in 13 counties served by the Windsor storeroom.


