Boar Season

Robbinsville, N. C.—The wild boar season this year will run from October 20 to January 1, and guides are already getting reservations from eastern sportsmen.

Game census shows there are more Russian wild boar in Graham county, N. C., than any other county in America. The boar are quite different from "wild boar" ordinarily hunted, which usually are domesticated hogs run wild. The "Rooshians," as the natives call the animals, are descendants of stock imported years ago by an Englishman, and are lean and fast with long black hair and curling tusks. When excited, they will charge anything that moves, and range in weight up to 500 pounds. They are hunted by Platt bear dogs.

Farmer Should Send Dry Cotton To Gin

Farmers of North Carolina lose nearly a quarter of a million dollars annually from rough-ginned cotton, says J. C. Ferguson, cotton gin specialist of the State College Extension Service. But he hastily adds, "the fault is not all with the ginner. If the grower will send his cotton to the gin in a dry clean-picked condition, most of this loss can be eliminated."

Less than half of the North Carolina cotton crop of last year passed middling, or better, in grade. "With the season we had last September and October, much more of our cotton should have passed higher in grade," the specialist stated.

"The often green or damp cotton is carried directly from the field to the gin, and the farmer expects a miracle of the ginner in demanding a smoothly-ginned bale. It is impossible for any ginner, regardless of how well he may be equipped (unless he has a mechanical drier) to produce a smooth sample from green or damp cotton.

"Many farmers also depend too much on the ginner to clean their cotton. While modern cleaning machinery will remove large quantities of hulls, stems, leaf trash, etc., there has not yet been made a machine that will get all the trash. Therefore, the more cleanly the cotton is picked, the more improvement the cleaners will make," Ferguson declared.

As advice to ginner, the State College man said that the average gin is fed too fast, producing a tight roll. Some farmers insist that their seed be ginned closely but the slightest gain made in the weight of the bale will be more than offset by the loss incurred through discounting of poorly-prepared cotton by the mills.
