Camp Davis, one of America's first Coast Artillery Anti Aircraft Training Centers is now more than 85 per cent complete...

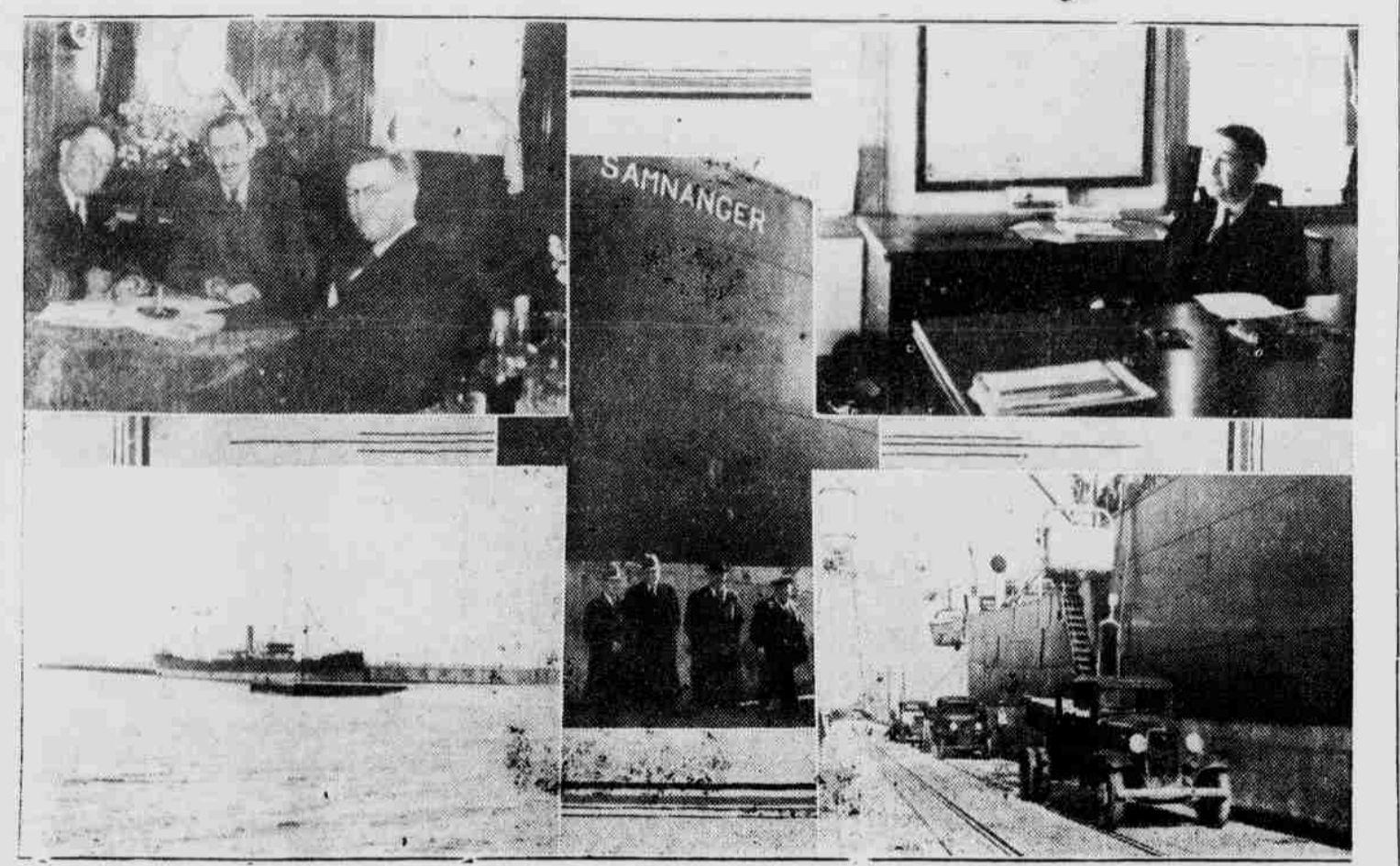

Washington, D. C. NAZIS SHY OF MAGNESIUM
