ANSWERS

To Timely Farm Questions

Question: What type of brooder is recommended for a small poultry flock?

Answer: A home-made lamp brooder, which can be built at a cost of from \$5.00 to \$7.50, will accommodate 50 to 60 chicks. County farm and home agents of the State College Extension Service will supply blueprints and detailed information for the construction of one of these brooders. Farm people also may obtain one of these blueprints free by writing to the Extension Poultryman, State College, Raleigh, and requesting Blueprint No. 46, "The Home-made Lamp Brooder."

Question: What is the best fertilizer for peanuts?

Answer: Dr. E. R. Collins, agronomist of the State College Experiment Station, says that calcium appears to be the first requirement for the production of well-filled peanuts in North Carolina. Ground dolomitic limestone supplies calcium as well as magnesium, and at the same time neutralizes the soil. Burned lime and potash supply calcium and neutralize the soil, and land plaster supplies calcium and sulphur, but does not neutralize the soil. For detailed information on peanut fertilizers, see your county farm agent or write to the Agronomy Department, N. C. State College, Raleigh.

Question: What are the best varieties of soybeans to grow for oil.

Answer: The State College Experiment Station has found that the Herman, Mammoth Yellow, Tokio, and Biloxi beans yield the highest percentage of oil. The Herman, Mammoth Yellow and Tokio varieties shatter badly, and the Biloxi makes a low yield of
