**Morehead Hospital Wing To Be Ready For Patients Monday**

The 32-bed addition to Emergency Hospital at Morehead City, built under the supervision of the Richmond regional office of the Federal Works Agency, will be ready for occupancy by next Monday, FWA Regional Engineer C. L. Vickers announced today.

The building, a temporary frame structure with concrete floors, was erected in less than six

weeks after work was started, The job of painting the building and installing plumbing, heating and electrical equipment is expected to be completed this week. The new addition will increase the hospital's capacity to 60 beds.

The hospital annex was built as a war public works project to provide medical care for military personnel and war workers in the Morehead City area. A Federal grant of \$54,000 was allotted to Morehead City to cover the cost of construction and equipment. The construction work was done by the T. A. Loving Company, general contractors, of Goldsboro.
