Cuts Pulpwood To Keep Tenants Busy

Cutting pulpwood during slack seasons will enable many landlords to keep their tenants busy throughout the year, earning extra money and better satisfied, reports Farm Forester H. E. Blanchard of Whiteville to the State College Extension Service.

He cites the plan of a Columbus County farmer, who has 140 acres in timber, to employ his two tenants in thinning out the pulpwood over a five year period, or about thirty acres a year.

"At the end of five years, the grower will be able to start cutting pulpwood all over again. At the end of his second thinning cycle, he will have a stand of sawtimber that is about ready to cut on a selective basis," Blanchard points out.

The Columbus County farmer is

of the opinion, according to the forester, "That many tenants move just because they haven't anything else to do for two or three months of the year when they would like to be earning extra money. Tenants are better satisfied when they can be kept busy during the entire year."

In cutting the pulpwood referred to above, the grower plans to cut all oak, gum and other material not fitted for pulpwood and use it as heater wood or tobacco wood.

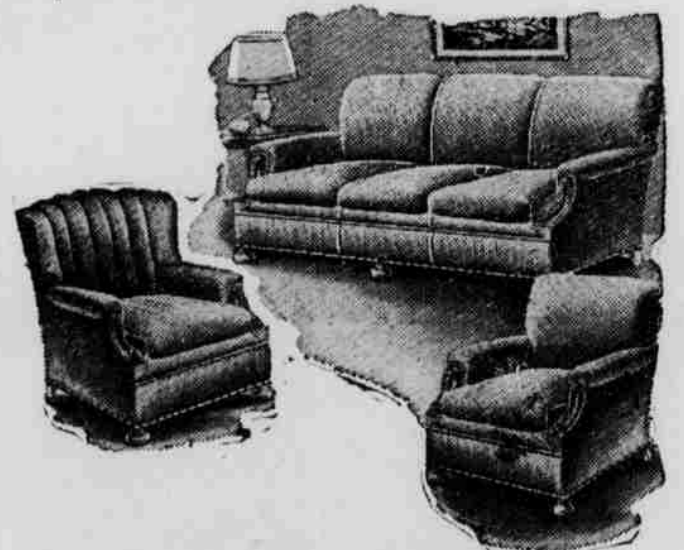
