STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

Q. When is the best time to plant my soybeans?

Ans. Plant as soon as practical in the Coastal Plain and Piedmont, and after May 15 in the Mountains says Dr. E. R. Collins, agronomist with the Extension Service. Woods Yellow, Tokio, Ogden, and Volstate are good adapted varieties to use, he says. Plant the beans two to four inches apart in the rows, and inoculate where soybeans have not been grown recently. Use a weeder early. North Carolina Extension Circular 256 will give you the recommendations for growing and fertilizing your soybean crop.

Q. How can I provide year round grazing for my hogs?

Ans. For summer grazing, Biloxi, Tokio or Woods Yellow soybeans can be grazed as soon as they are 12 inches high, says Ellis Vestal, swine specialist of the State College Extension Service. Lespedeza will furnish grazing from the middle of June until cold weather. Mixtures of soybeans and Sudan grass also give good summer and fall grazing, he says. For late fall, winter and spring grazing, a mixture of 30 pounds of rye grass and 10 pounds of crimson clover seeded broadcast in September is excellent. For winter and fall grazing, small grain mixtures may also be used.

Q. How can I prepare my lambs for shipment to market?

Ans. Creep feeding is one of the best ways to increase the weight and grade of your lambs economically, says L. I. Case, Extension specialist in animal industry at State College. Corn or some other fattening feed, such as barley or wheat, is best for lambs that are going to the market. This fattening feed, together with the mother's milk and plenty of good grazing, assures a good top lamb. Experimental results have shown that where the pasture is especially good, and the ewes milking well creep feeding is unnecessary, but in the majority of cases, the specialist says, it will pay.

College Hints For Farm Homemakers

Blanket storage time is here. Store your blankets in the coolest place you have. Don't pile sheets, quilts, or comforters on top of them as it crushes the nap.

Clean your blankets before you put them away. Brush them often to remove dust and lint and to keep the nap fluffy which makes for better insulation and warmth. Always brush lengthwise of the blanket, never across. Sunshine and air will help bring up the nap.

Mend the thin worn places before you store your blankets, and if there is need for a new binding too, don't wait until winter comes again to get the job done.

If you do not plan to store your woolen garments in bags, boxes, or special closets, by all means, hang them outdoors often and brush them thoroughly. Moth damage to clothes and household goods is something over \$100,000,000.00 a year. Poor housekeeping is largely responsible for this — woolen clothes and fur trimmed garments are left hanging in closets all summer long, full of dirt and grease spots which is food for moths. They aren't even cleaned, aired, or sunned. Moths do not harm clean garments. And don't be stingy with moth balls and moth fumigants.

Take time and do a good job of house cleaning this year. One room at a time is enough — walls to clean, windows and woodwork to wash, window shades to dust and clean, bureau drawers, and closet, bed, springs and mattress to take care of. Organized house cleaning makes the job easier.

MORE TELEPHONES COMING

Resumption of manufacture of civilian-type telephones to the extent of 200,000 sets per quarter has been authorized by the War Production Board. First deliveries are expected by fall. Approximately 100,000 new orders for telephones that cannot be filled because of lack of equipment are accumulating each month.

Truck Farm Turns In Good Profit

F. A. Holden, a farmer in the Glenville section of Jackson County, has demonstrated that a combination of vegetable production, livestock raising and poultry results in one of the most profitable types of farming and gives a better distribution of labor throughout the year, says H. R. Niswonger, horticulturist with the Extension Service at State College.

Holden's total gross income in 1943 from the sale of his produce was \$2,457.86, divided in this way:

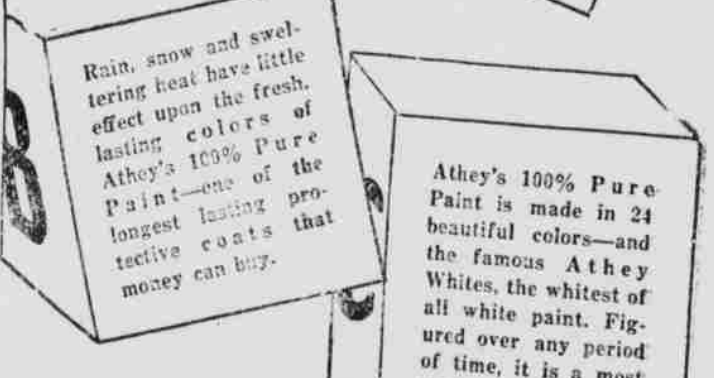
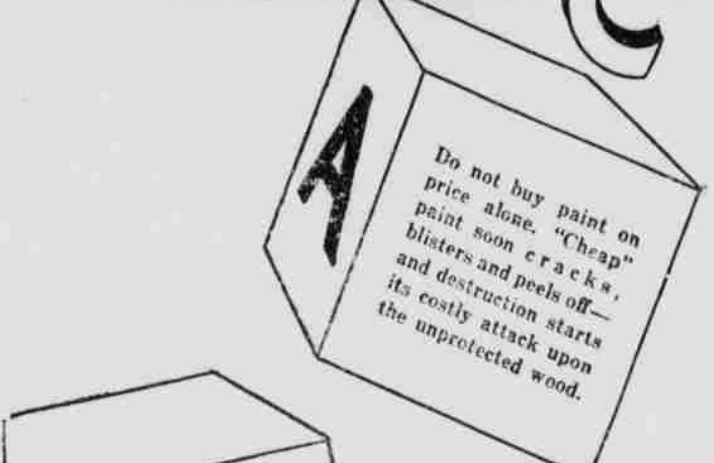

Vegetable crops, \$1,897.76 and livestock, poultry and eggs, \$560.20. His cash outlay for hired labor, fertilizer and other farm supplies was \$798.37, leaving a net income of \$1,659.59.

His farm consists of 104 acres, of which 45 are classed as cultivated land and 20 acres are in pasture. In 1943 he had two and a half acres in potatoes, one in cabbage, one in snap beans and three in turnips and cucumbers.

He grows most of the feed for his livestock and poultry as well as most of the food for his family. He follows a practice of crop rotation in growing his truck crops on land that has been limed and phosphated.

Crimson clover follows corn, snap beans and other cultivated crops as a winter cover crop that is turned under in the spring and the land is then used for some other cultivated crop.

Another rotation is the sowing of a winter cover crop consisting of eight pounds of red clover or crimson clover, four pounds of herd grass and ten pounds of orchard grass. This crop remains on the ground for two years with one cutting for hay and the next year is turned under and planted to truck crops.
