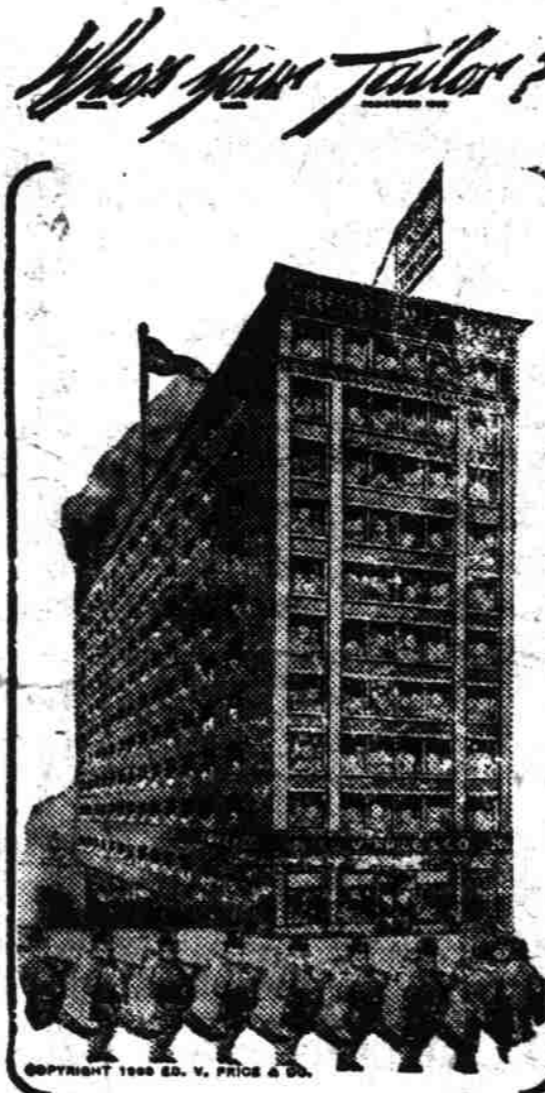
Messrs. Combs' think they have made a good trade and thereby secured one of the finest and best farms in the South.
