How one's faith in the virtues of endless medications with strange and outlandish names will be shattered when no longer the ancient nomenclature appears! And what effect will the absence of those variously colored bottles, with their vague and inscrutable contents, have upon the old-time delicious loafing about the store? That is the question. And so we say, stay the ruthless hand that would blot out one of the 300 drugs in the national pharmacopoeia.
