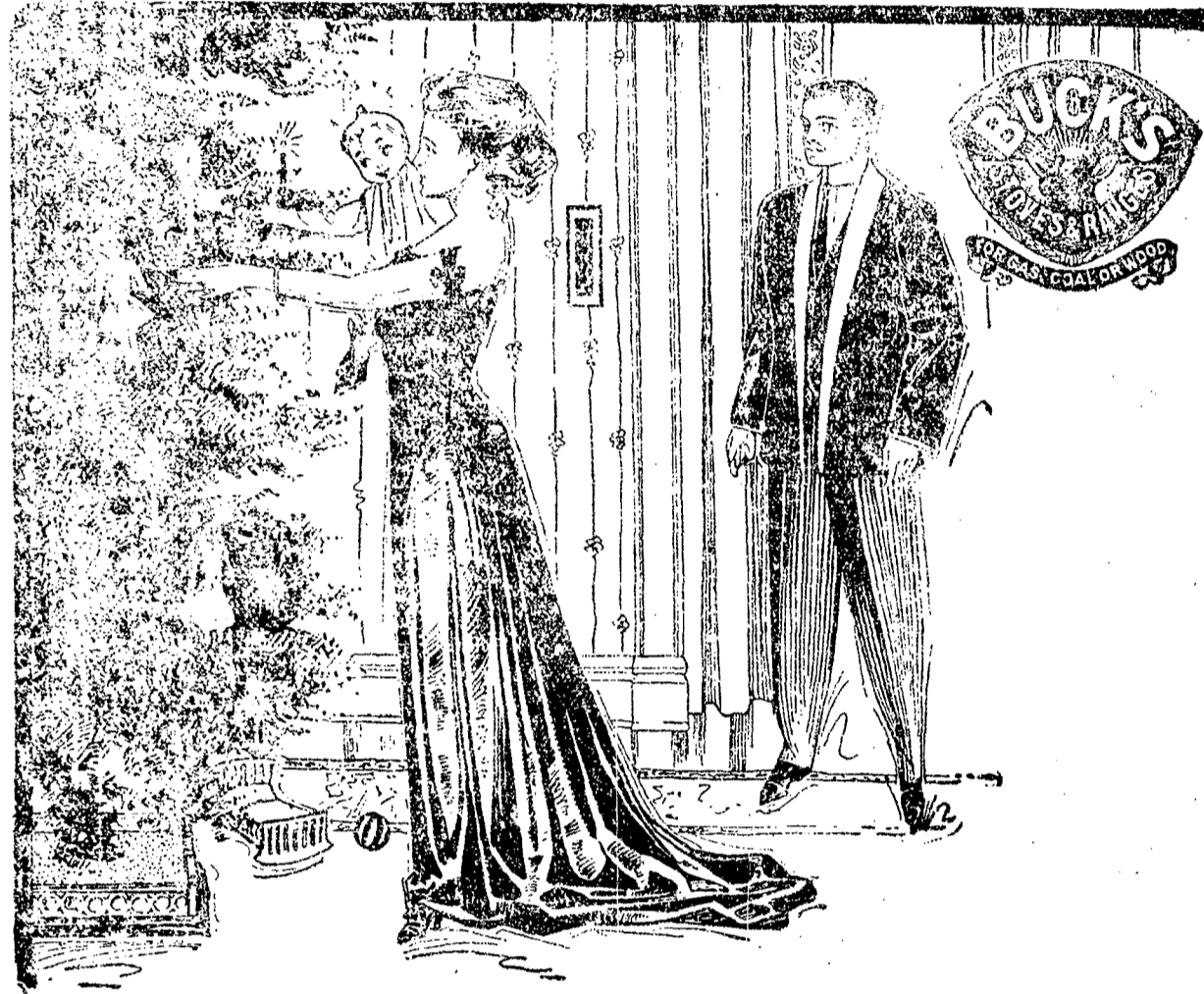
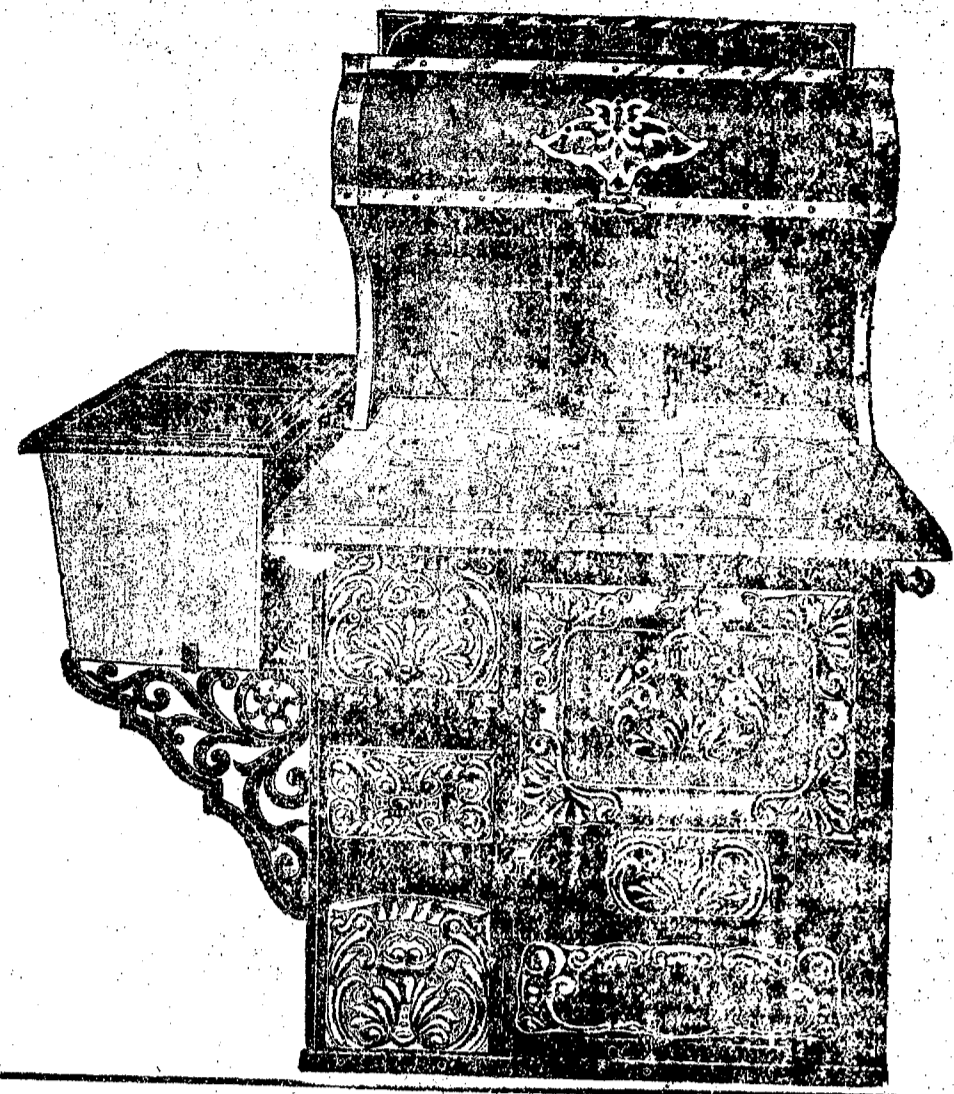

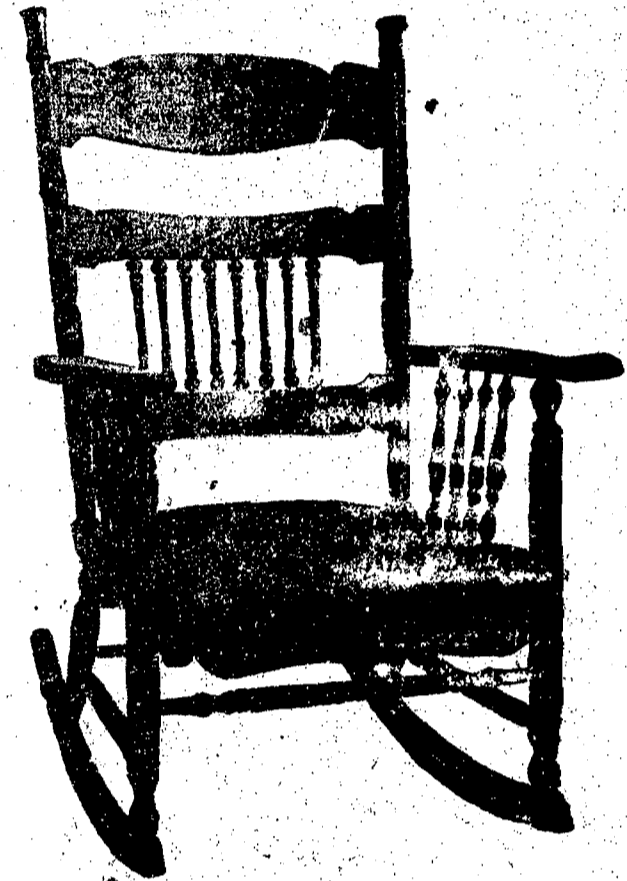

A company has been formed in Winston-Salem for the manufacture of furnace ore from iron pyrites, the by-product obtained in the manufacture of commercial fertilizer. The plant will utilize the pyrite cinders from the fertilizer plants at Winston-Salem, Durham, Greenville, S. C., and other points, and will have an output of 50,000 tons of ore per year.

A range exploding in Mrs. M. E. Howle's kitchen, of Asheville, last Thursday, created great excitement and caused the fire alarm to be turned in. The kitchen was wrecked and a great hole was blown in the wall, the range shattered and the kitchen utensils. Mrs. Howle had built a fire and just left the room when the explosion came, due to a frozen waterback to the range.
