ROBBED POSTOFFICE.

More Than \$2,500 in Money and Stamps Were Taken.

Wheeling W. Va. Feb. 17. — The post-office at Elm Grove was robbed of \$2,500 in money and stamps early today. Shortly after the theft was discovered Harry Smith was arrested on the suspicion and other arrests are expected. An organized gang of burglars working in this vicinity is believed to have been responsible for the robbery of four postoffices and three banks during the last three months.

Later another man who gave his name as Sam Austin was arrested in a cave a few miles from the scene of the robbery after a hot fight in which a number of shots were fired.

Cause of Railway Accidents.

According to information gathered and published by the Interstate Commerce Commission, carelessness by employes causes many railway accidents. It is not quite possible to determine how much of this carelessness might be traceable to the company. For instance, where a youth of 20, with only three months' experience on that line, is placed in responsible position as operator it is only fair to divide the blame for a disaster due to his carelessness or inefficiency between him and the railroad company which engaged him. The commission's Accident Bulletin, covering casualties for July, August and September of 1910, presents a list of 17 accidents, many of which results in heavy losses of life. Six might be laid to sheer carelessness, three for disregard for, or obedience of orders; one to intoxication, two to wilful neglect of duty, two to causes undetermined, one to unavoidable cause (cloudburst) and two to rank inefficiency. On the face of these returns it is only fair to concede that the railroad companies have a serious problem on their hands in this matter of dealing with accidents.
