Newspapers throughout the United States are printing what is effected to be a letter written by Christ. 10 inis letter was an injunction that it should be published to the world by whoever found it, together with the statement that misfortune and bad luck would follow the person having possession of it in the event that i was not given publicity. There was likewise a promise that whoever may have a copy of this in his or her possession will prosper and be followed Any young man or woman who is by good fortune. According to the signed by the Angel Gabriel, ninetynine years after the Savior's birth and presumably deposited by him under a stone at the fact of the cross. "blessed is he who shall turn me over." the letter which follows was discov

"Whosoever works on the Sabbath day shall be cursed. I command you to go to church and keep hold the Lord's day without any manner of retition or desiring information work. You shall not idle and misspend your time in hedecking yourself in superfluities of costly apparel and vain dressing for I have ordered it a day of rest. I will have that day kept holy that your sins may be

"You will not break any commandments, but observe and keep them, they being written by my hand, and spoken from my mouth. You shall not only go to church yourself, but also your man servant and maid serva: t. Observe my words and learn my commandments.

"You shall finish your work every Saturday at six o'clock in the afternoon at which hour the preparation for the Sabbath begins. I advise you to fast five days in the year beginning on Good Friday and continuing the five days following in remembrance at the five bloody wounds I received for you and mandkind. You shall love one another and cause them that are not baptized to come to church and receive the Hely Sacra-


