Mebane, Sept. 25.—Special. Mr. James Bradshaw died suddenly Thursday afternoon near the home of his son on the Latham farm. He was in the tobacco field helping with the work, apparently as well as usual, when he fell. Death was due to heart failure, possibly brought on by taking too much exercise and getting too warm. He was 77 years old, a Confederate veteran and had been a member of Salem Methodist Protestant Church for many years. Several months ago he sold his farm near Salem Church, and came to live with his son, who is manager of the Latham farm. The funeral services

were conducted by Rev. W. E. Swain, and the interment was in the Salem Cemetery, Friday afternoon.
 Best man, Jesse, with whom he lived, Mr. Bradshaw's only son, Charles of Greensboro, a single daughter, and another daughter, now Mrs. Jennings of Gibsonville.
