

Carranza Making Strong Efforts to Vanquish the Villa Army; Troops in Texas-Five Trains With Men and Guns Crossed the Border.

El Paso, Texas, Oct. 29.-Two batteries of American artillery numbering eight guns were secretly posted after dark tonight with their muzzles pointed toward Juarez, where a Villa garrison of 1,500 men had given apparntly hostile signs toward American troops on border patrol.

The first train load of the 5,000 troops, which General Carranza is sending through the United States from Eagle Pass, Texas, to Agua Prieia, Senora, was expected to pass through this city soon after midnight. The passage of these troops over American soil to fight Villa in Senora has angered the Juarez garrison and there is danger of trouble. All the American soldiers stationed here, about 5,000 men, were ordered out tonight to guard the railway over which the Carranza train will pass to prevent Villa supporters from at


