Writing from this city, Carl Hoessler, "Federated Press staff correspondent." acknowledges that the communists have failed in their "boring" policy. "The campaign will now become straight

communist," he says.
"The new radical ticket, which declares itself communist under the Workers' party name," Hoessler continues, "is William Z. Foster, Chicago, chairman Workers party, for president; Ben Gitlow, New York, member Workers' party exective committee, for vice-president. State and local candidates will be run under the party name wherever possible."

This declaration from authoritative communist sources, clarifies the situation. At last the communists have been driven out in the open and they now acknowledge they are what organized labor has claimed—revolutionists who are only interested in social and political upheavals.

Trade unionists and sympathizers have no excuse to be fooled hereafter by the communists, whose only interest in organized labor is to further their revolutionary program—and to divide the workers.
