### THE WORK OF THE EVANGELIST.

In an interview with Dr. W. A. Nelson, of Asheville, he suggested a line of labor in which an Evangelist, who was qualified for the work, might be very useful and do an important service in very many of our churches.

Such an Evangelist as is here contemplated should not have as his chief aim the bringing of the Gospel to bear upon the hearts of the unconverted directly, but the bringing up of the churches and the pastors to the work of converting souls without the help of Evangelist, or any external aid indeed.

To effect this, two very damaging impressions must be removed—first, the idea which extensively prevails that the pastor is responsible for the conversion of the ungodly. The truth is, the church and pastor are both equally responsible for this blessed work—God has made them so, and they were intended in the divine economy of grace to work together. The many figures used in the Bible, the salt, the light, the seed, the leaven, the epistles known and read of all men—every one of these and many others, go to show that the work of diffusing the Gospel light and receiving souls to Christ rests upon the membership of the church even more than upon the pastors. The philosophy of the New Testament Evangelism calls for the personal influence and the personal effort of every individual member of Christ's Kingdom. The best preaching on the part of the pastor will be powerless to convert sinners unless the church is interested in and actively laboring for the same end. Again and again has this been demonstrated in the experience of all pastors. The labors of the most successful, and gifted evangelist may be secured, but nothing will be accomplished until the people feel the worth and danger of souls and get down to praying and laboring for their salvation. The people then need to be taught that they not only ought, but that they can be effective agents in winning souls to Christ.

The other serious error into which the churches have fallen is that they need not expect conversions except as the result of special revival efforts. Given a duly organized church, with a good pastor, and conversions should follow legitimately—it is constituted for this very purpose and possesses powers adequate to the production of such a result. A church, in a normal, healthy spiritual condition can not fail to have conversions under the ordinary preaching of the Gospel. Times of special refreshing from the presence of the Lord will come, and ought to be prayed for and eagerly desired. There always have been times of gracious revival in the history of grace, but surely no church ought to be satisfied to remain long without the manifestation of converting power.

The custom of our churches, in town and country, of exhibiting a periodical, spasmodic convulsive zeal for the regeneration of souls has proven a Pandora's box of evils, most, if not all of which, might be avoided if the churches were expecting the work of the Lord to go on continuously and were laboring with that intent.

It is very certain that the present state of things in the churches is far from satisfactory, and it is growing worse and worse from year to year. I have seen it illustrated in my church in Wilmington. Last spring we had a series of meetings. Bro. W. B. Oliver, of Fayetteville, preached the Gospel in great purity and power for two weeks; I have scarcely heard better preaching, or that which was better calculated to awaken saints and sinners and yet the net gain to the church was very meager, and that just because the membership never became aroused; they never got to work in earnest and seemed to be awaiting some extraordinary appliances to be used, such as characterized the great and blessed Pearson meeting two years ago. The good old-fashioned, spontaneous revivals which used to bless the churches, under the leadership of the pastor, or with the help of a brother pastor, seem almost to belong to the past.—Charity and Children.

Last week Dr. Talmage preached a sermon at a Farmers' encampment, during the course of which he related the case of a farmer who said to his indolent son: "There are a hundred dollars buried deep in that field." The son went to work and plowed it very deep, and then complained that he had not found the money; but when the crop had been gathered and sold for a hundred dollars more than any previous year then the young man took the hint as to what his father meant when he said there were a hundred dollars buried down in that field.

The Advocate believes the Alliance has been no small factor in securing diversified crops. We have been preaching that doctrine for years and we are glad to be in such good company in so noble a cause.—Wilson Advance.

### TAKING GOD AT HIS WORD.

Mr. Wesley, much pleased at the simplicity and correctness of the answer, told his preachers in conference that there could be no better definition. During a religious awakening in a factory village in New England, a forger was convicted but could not find peace. His superior sent him a letter, requesting him to call at six o'clock. He promptly came. "I see you are taking me at my word," said the foreman. "Well, see," said the master, "here is another letter sending for you by One far more trustworthy than I can be," holding up a slip of paper with some text of Scripture written on it. The forger read the paper and began to read slowly. "Come—unto-me—all—ye—that—labor,—and—I—will—give—you—rest." His lips quivered, his eyes filled with tears, and he said at length: "Am I just to believe that in the same way I believed your letter?" "Just in the same way," said the master. "Take God at his Word just as you take me at my word." The man did so and was saved.—Raleigh Christian Advocate.

A MINE OF TAR.

But the matter of interest now is what appears to be a mine of actual tar which has been found on Mr. R. S. Pullen's land, about four miles from the city. The substance, whatever it is, comes from out the side of a bank of earth in a stream about the consistency of putty. This stream (if it may be called a stream) forces its way out of the land pure and solid. It is about six inches in diameter, it is cut off when three or four inches have oozed out.
