THREE CALLS FOR A NON-PARTISAN

Elsewhere we publish a call for a silver convention to be held in Raleigh on September 25th. The nature of the call is non-partisan; in fact it is practically stated that partisanism in any shape is not invited. While this is so, we notice that all the signers of this call are Democrats. It would seem, if it was intended to call a non-partisan convention, that the names of members of other parties should be attached
