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The Peoples Party National Platform

Following is the Peoples Party National Platform adopted: The Peoples Party assembled in National convention, reaffirms its allegiance to the principles declared by the founders of the party, and hereby approves the platform of the party in 1902.

1. We demand a National money, safe and sound, issued by the government, not without the intervention of any bank, and we pledge the people to support such a money.

2. We demand the free and unrestricted coinage of silver and gold in the ratio of 16 to 1 without waiting for the consent of foreign nations.

3. We demand that the government pay the principal of its obligations in legal tender, and that it should not be allowed to surrender this option to the holders of government obligations.

4. We demand that postal savings banks be established by the government, and that the savings of the people and to facilitate exchange.

5. We demand that the government exchange a public utility, the government should own and operate the railroads in the interest of the people on a non-partisan basis, and that it should not be allowed to surrender this option to the holders of government obligations.

6. We demand that the government issue a national currency, and that it should not be allowed to surrender this option to the holders of government obligations.
