THE NEW BULL-PEN ELECTION LAW

Its Provisions as Interpreted by a Leading Democratic Paper.

The recent Legislature repealed the non-partisan election laws of 1895 and 1897, which guaranteed to every party the right to be represented on election boards...

1. That the election for State and county officers shall be held on the first Thursday in August and every two years thereafter.

2. That there shall be a State board of elections composed of five persons elected by the Legislature for a term of two years.

3. That there shall be a county board of elections consisting of three persons, appointed by State board for a term of two years.

4. That the State Board of elections shall meet in Raleigh the first Monday in May, 1899, and organize by electing one of their number chairman and another secretary.

5. That the county boards must meet not later than the first Monday in May for organization, and for dividing the counties into precincts and polling places.

6. That county boards must meet not later than the first Monday in May for organization, and for dividing the counties into precincts and polling places.

7. That before the next general election there shall be an entirely new registration. Among questions to be asked are...

8. That the registration books shall be kept open twenty days and closed on the second Saturday before the election.

9. That on or before the first Monday in July the county board shall appoint two judges of election for each precinct.

10. That to prevent disorders many as three special officers may be appointed by the registrars...
