Its Provisions as Interpreted by a Leading

Democratic Paper.

The recent Legislature repealed the non-partisan election laws of 1895 and 1897, which guaranteed to every party the right to be represented on election boards by election officers of their own choosing, and D enacted an election law more vicious than infamous Simmons Bull-Pen Election law that was in force before

The leading provisions of this law MEED as published by the Raleigh News & HEAH

Observer are as follows: 1. That the election for State and OACH county officers shall be held on the first Thursday in August and every two years thereafter.

2. That there shall be a State DEC board of elections composed of five O. Do persons elected by the Legislature for a term of two years. 3. That there shall be a county

for a term of two years. 4. That the State Board of elections shall meet in Raleigh the first Mon day in May, 1899, and organize by

electing one of their number chairman and another secretary. Another meeting shall be held on the firs Monday in April in each electron year. Special meetings may be call ed when necessary. For their services the board shall receive four dollars appoint all registrars and judges of elections. Members of the county boards may be removed by the State board; and the county board in turn may remove any registrar or judge

of election. 6. That county boards must meet not later than the first Monday in May for organization, and for dividing the counties into precincts and polling places.

7. That before the next general election there shall be an entirely new registration. 




