



Protection From Enemies Furnished

All Living Things. By a decree of nature, one-half the world flourishes at the expense of the other half. The sparrow chases the butterfly, but the hawk chases the sparrow. So we see that every creature is provided with some more or less effective quality of defence, by means of which the attacks of its natural enemies are ren-

The armadillo, rolled in its wondrous coat of mail, lies secure among a score of hungry, gnawing foes, while the white hare, scarcely distinguishable from the snow on which it crouches, is often overlooked by his fee the fox. But of all creatures none nave received more ample protection than the insects. Some of them possess stings, others bite, and a few puff out clouds of polsonous vapor to stupefy or blind their pursuers. Again, there are insects clothed in impenetrable armor, insects covered with sharp spines and prickles and others whose means of defence consists in nothing but a likeness to the objects which sur-






