Then Mahaffety decided he did not want to come to the Penitentiary anyway-possibly because it is more pleasant in Weastern North Carolina in the summer, but at any rate the fact remains that he didn't wish to come, so Governor Aycock pardoned him for \$3000 which was to be added to the school fund. This case happened two or three weeks ago but we have refrained from mentioning it before, as we thought it possible there was some mistake in the matter, but after waiting this long we have not seen the affair denied, but on the contrary have seen the report offirmed in nearly all the papers.
