Ent His Life Bince Killing His Wife. Greensboro, N. C., Dec. 4 .- Dr. Joseph B. Matthews, who is in jail awaiting a hearing upon the charge of causing the death of his wife by poison on Friday last, made a second attempt to commit suicide today Late yesterday afternoon he diluted the heads of a number of matches in a cup of water and swallowed the contents. He soon lost consciousness, but his groans attracted the attention of a prison guard, who sum moned a physician and his life was saved. Today after sharpening the edge of a pewter spoon on his cell floor he opened an artery in his wrist, but the flow of blood was stopped in time again to save his life. Matthews is raving in his delirium.






