Augusta, Ga., May 7 .- Charlie Harris, a negro farm hand, who yesterday afternoon shot and fatally wounded Harden Pearson, a prominent farmer, near Dearing, Ga., 25 miles west of Augusta, was taken into the heart of a deep swamp about 9 o'clock last night and swung up to a convenient tree. His body was riddled with bullets and left

suspended. The mob of forty unmasked men proceeded from the scene of the lynching to the home of Harris, on Pearson's farm, where all grown members of his family were severely whipped and ordered to leave Mc-Duffie County, never to return, on pain of death. They left All were considered a bad lot.

Pearson was remonstrating with Harris because of poor work that had been done, when the negro became infuriated, drew a revolver and emptied the contents into Pearson's Nine were killed and many injured body. 
