## WAKE COUNTY NEWS.

Mrs. Len H. Adams, of Raleigh, died Saturday morning after an illness of several months.

Mr. C. B. Edwards, of the firm of Edwards & Broughton, of this city, was painfully injured in a runaway Friday afternoon.

The democrats of Johnston County have declared for Mr. Ashley Horne, of Clayton, for Governor, and Locke Craig, of Asheville, announced Tuesday that he would be in the race next year.

Gov. Glenn Monday afternoon pardoned D. D. Williams, a white man, who was convicted in the police court in this city last August for assault and battery, and sentenced to twelve months on the County roads. Williams has served nine months of his time, and on the recommendation of the police justice and some citizens of Raleigh, Gov. Glenn granted the pardon.

Mr. George H. Snyder, manager of the Raleigh branch of the W. W. Kimball Piano Co., has mailed to Mrs. F. O. Cox, of Wake Forest, a certificate valued at \$200, for sending in the most complete word-list in a \$2,500 contest, begun April 23d.

A list of words was sent out numbering 1,093 letters. The person spelling correctly the largest number of cities from the words was to get the first prize.

Mrs. Cox spelled correctly the names of 167 cities, being found in the list of words sent out by Mr. Snyder.

Mr. Snyder recently opened a branch house for W. W. Kimball under the Academy of Music, and the contest was held to advertise the firm.

## A CASE OF INFANTICIDE.

Rosa Johnson Implicates an Old Colored Woman of Raleigh.

Rosa Johnson, a young white woman of Raleigh, was arrested a few days ago on the charge of killing her new born babe. She showed that the child had been murdered and thrown in a garden near the Johnson woman's home. She was carried to the hospital under guard where she will remain until she is stronger, when she will be placed in jail. The woman has made a confession and implicates Elvira Powell, an old colored woman who was present when the child was born. She says the woman took the child to take care of it.

The negro woman has been arrested but denies her guilt. A warrant has also been issued for the young man supposed to be the father of the child, but his name has not been made public.

## Convict Got Guard's Gun and Escaped.

Elizabeth City, N. C., May 11.—A white convict on the chain gang escaped this morning from the camps about twelve miles from the city. One of the guards went into the stockade to unchain the prisoners for breakfast. He laid down his rifle. A white convict as soon as he was unchained secured the gun and covered the guard. The convict came out of the stockade and forced the other guard to hold his hands up and then backed off into the woods and escaped.

## DURHAM POLICE HAVE BUSY DAY.

Harvey Lyons Kills James Simmons With a Rock—Negro Cut Hillman High—Ed Bass Arrested for Wife-Beating.

Durham, May 11.—A fatal affair grew out of a play and scuffle between two negroes on West Main street, near the Duke factory this afternoon at 1 o'clock. James Simmons and Harvey Lyon were first in a play and then in a scuffle that resulted in both parties getting mad. The killing of Simmons followed, a rock being used by Lyon.

There is one circumstance or coincidence in this case that is of unusual interest. Years ago Beck Lyon, the mother of Harvey Lyon, was arrested on the charge of murder. With her was a man who it was claimed by the State had killed his wife and children on account of the Lyon woman. They were both placed in jail at Hillsboro, this being before Durham County was formed. While Beck Lyon was in jail this Harvey Lyon was born. Born in jail, when his mother was charged with murder, he is today back in jail charged with murder. It is a circumstance that is unusual—it is a strange coincidence.

Soon after the killing of Simmons there was another excitement when Hillman High, a white man, was badly cut by Ed Bass, colored. Bass was arrested, this being after a considerable chase, however, and he was locked up. The wounds received by High were not such as to make his condition serious, but the information is that the assault was almost unprovoked.

About the time that Bass was being brought in the officers arrested a negro on the charge of beating his wife. This caused a great deal of excitement for a few minutes. It looked like the newly elected police officers were getting a good breaking in on their first day.

## Two Men Shot Dead, Woman in Jail.

Marion, N. C., May 14.—Yesterday a closed carriage left Marion in the direction of Spruce Pine, which attracted more or less attention. Deputy Sheriffs Boone and Buchanan of Mitchell County, soon rode into town, stating that they were after Massey Sarrels. They followed the carriage and came upon him near Spruce Pine. Sarrels opened fire on them. After an exchange of shots, Buchanan fell dead, and in a moment Sarrels was the victim of Sheriff's Boone's steady aim.

The officers were armed with a bench warrant for Sarrels and his wife, charging him with highway robbery. The story goes that Sarrels and his wife some months ago conspired to rob Senator Burlison, of Mitchell County, that Burlison was invited to come to the home of Sarrels and take a deer hunt. He arrived just before day, and after something of unusual interest was shown him by Sarrel's wife, Sarrel walked in with a double-barrel shot gun and told him to get ready or die or give him \$2,000. Burlison gave him all the money he had.

## AN EXPLOSION NEAR NEWBERN.

Building Stored With Dynamite Blown Up—Two Men Injured.

New Bern, N. C., May 14.—This city was shaken by a dynamite explosion at 8:30 o'clock this morning. Frank McGehee and Watson Fleming, linemen, employed in the construction of the Western Union telegraph line, were shooting at a mark with a pistol. McGehee drew a bead on a knot hole in a board building which contained 1,600 pounds of dynamite. McGehee was ignorant of the fact, however. The bullet hit the house and the result was a terrific explosion, the shock being felt by every person in the city.

The house is located about two miles from New Bern. Strangely enough the injuries received by both men will not result seriously, although they are very painful.

## "Skidoo" No Longer Name of Post-Office.

Franklin, Pa., May 11.—Yielding to the protests of the hundreds of patrons of Skidoo postoffice, Venango County, the postoffice department decided to discontinue that name. Cherry Brook has been substituted. Ridiculed by their friends in other places on account of the name, the patrons fought bitterly to have it changed, and even enlisted the support of friends in Washington.

## The Richest Church in America.

The income of Trinity Church, New York city, outside of church offertories, last year amounted to \$775,000. The church offertories raised the amount to above one million dollars. Last year it paid \$127,000 in taxes on its property. It keeps a number of chapels, paying all the expenses. It is decidedly the richest church in the United States.—New York Episcopalian.
