



She showed that the child had been murdered and thrown in a garden near the Johnson woman's home. She was carried to the hospital under guard where she will remain until she is stronger, when she will be placed in jail. The woman has made a con ell, an old colored woman who was conspired to rob Senator Burlison, present when the child was born. She says the woman took the child to take care of it.

The negro woman has been arrested but denies her guilt. A warrant has also been issued for the young man supposed to be the father of the child, but his name has not been made public.


