-Murderer Has Bad Record.

Asheville, N. C., July 5 .- James B., Allison, formerly night watchman at the City Hall, shot and killed patrol wagon. After firing five bullets into McGee, Allison picked up a sledge-hammer and pounded several blows upon the skull of the dying man. The murder, within the heart of the section, created intense excitement, and great crowds soon gathered. Allison turned to walk off, and hearing cries of "Lynch him," surrendered to City Tax Collector C. H. Bartlett, and was turned over to dnece. Sheriff Hunter and landed in the county jail for safe-keeping. There apears to be a woman in the case as the cause of the trouble.

Allison has a wonderful record of killing people and escaping punishment, this making at least his fourth man that he has killed in Asheville. Each time he has escaped punishment upon one plea or another. While in the employ of the city three years ago as night watchman at the City Hall, he killed an engineer named Roberts, of Charlotte, whom he had placed under arrest, and his defense was self-defence.
