Twenty-Six Delegates and Alternates Elected to Charlotte Convention

Question of a County Ticket Was Defered Until After State Convention

The Republicans of Wake County held their convention in the auditorium in Raleigh Saturday and elected twenty-six delegates and twenty-six alternates to attend the Republican State Convention to be held in Charlotte, September 4th...
