

West Point safely. WASHINGTON, June 12 .- The Cubans have dispatches to the following effect:

Two expeditions of over 600 men, with arms, aminunition, and provisions, have safely landed and joined the patriots. The men are soldiers tried in the late American civil

The desertions from the Spaniards to the Cubans are frequent, causing frequent collisions between the troops and volunteers, whose animosities are irreconcilable.

The Cubans are organized into two army corps-one being commanded by General Thomas Jordan. A battle between Jordan's and Liscas's forces is daily expected. Jordan has over 2,000 Americans in his corps.

Cordova, Spain, June 12 .- A Republican meeting of 50,000 persons, including deputies from every southern province, yesterday protested against a monarchy. Revolutionary speeches were made. The Spanish and American flags, intertwined, elicited great applause, with shouts for America and Grant." While the meeting was in session the military and civil guard interfered, creating a panic in which women and children were trampled and several lives lost. The crowd then barricaded the streets. A serious affray is threatened.

London, June 12.-The House of Commons has postponed debate on the Alabama claims to the 10th of July.

The House of Lords has debated the disestablishment bill, but with no action. London, June 12 .- The Tines has additional particulars of the state of affairs in Paris. It says of the crowd that demolished the Kiesques and sung the Marseillaise at midwight: "It is not their political power which it is to be feared, but we must remenber that it is a long time since a crowd has disturbed the peace of Paris. It is a phenomena worthy of attention, coming as it does

after an election which gave nearly half the

votes of the country to the Opposition." The Daily News has an article on the subject, saying that Europe must look to an independent and increasing minority in the Corps Legislatif for a cessation of armed peace in France, which will be hardly less disastrous to civilization then a prolonged war. 
