EAST TRADE STREET IS BLOCKED FOR SUBWAY WORK

East Trade street at the point where the subway work is in progress was this morning completely roped off and closed to all except street car traffic. This move was made with the beginning of excavation work on the north side of the street, the south side having been closed up for a month. From now until the south side is completed and permanently paved, all vehicle, automobile and wagon traffic will have to be detoured by way of Fifth street or under the railroad tracks on Fourth street.

IT MAY BE NECESSARY FOR A SHORT TIME TO TRANSFER AT THE CROSSING. THE CARS WILL, HOWEVER, CONTINUE TO OPERATE FOR SOME TIME ON THE OLD TRACKS, UNTIL EVERYTHING IS READY FOR THE LAYING OF NEW TRACKS UNDER THE SUBWAY.

Some of the stores and other business establishments along the subway excavations have moved out, or will soon do so. What permanent arrangements all of these will make are not known, but not a few of the places of business will seek other locations permanently, it is understood today.

WANDERING CUR SAFE FOR PERIOD
