

Forecast for North Carolina: Fair tonight and Friday; warmer except in extreme east portion. Light to moderate northeast and east winds.

EXPLANATION OF TODAY'S MAP. The high pressure area which was noted yesterday over the Ohio Valley has moved slightly to the southeastward, appearing centrally on the map today over North Carolina. Its movement has resulted in cooler over the Southeast, frosts being general in Virginia and North Carolina.

The Southern disturbance is central today over the south central portion of Texas, over which State heavy rains

In the Canadian Northwest appears another barometric disturbance which covers a large area, over which cloudy and warmer weather prevails. Indications are for fair weather in Charlotte and vicinity tonight and Fr O. O. ATTO, Local Forecaster.

TURNSTILES INSTALLED AT THE **NEW FAIR GROUNDS**

Four Bright's coin control turnstiles are being installed at the new grounds of the Charlotte Fair Association which constitutes a very excellent feature of the equipment of the new grounds. These turnstiles require each person to drop the exact change into the receptacle prepared for it and the machine will not turn until this is done, one person only being admitted at a time. An accurate registration of each person entering is made at the same time and the slow process of selling tickets is thus done

There being four of these turnstiles just four times as many people can pass through the gates at one time as was possible by the old method. It will be necessary for each one desiring admission to the grounds to have the exact change ready to drop into the turnstile.

In place of the usual ticket sellers will be provided the means for making change to all who desire it. The new plan will permit of handling large crowds of people in a minimul space of time, and will prevent the annoying wait at the gate which is so objectionable to every one.

The inventor of the new machines will be on hand during the fair week to assist in getting them in proper operation. This method of passing people through the gates will probably meet with the approval of all just as soon as their operation is understood and people become accustomed to them.
