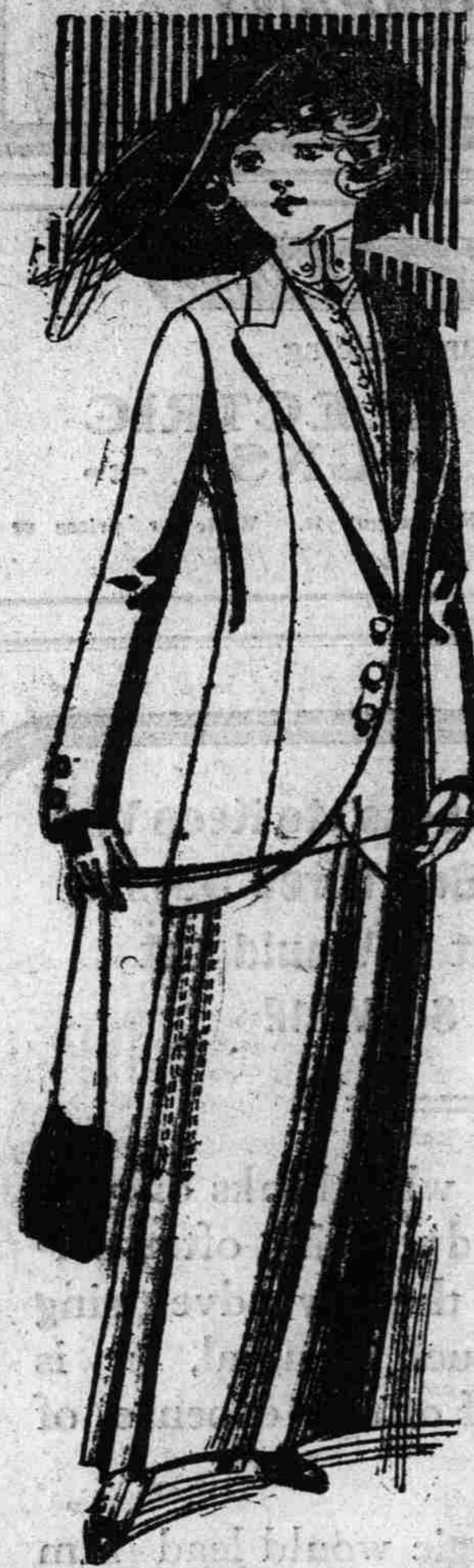

MASSACRE FOLLOWS IN WAKE OF TURKISH RETREAT

LONDON, Nov. 7.—The Constantinople correspondent of The Daily Chronicle sends the following: "At any moment the storm may break and involve us in the red ruin of a massacre and outrage. Some Constantinople itself will be surrounded. The last hours of Turkish ascendancy over the 'infidel' it is feared may be dyed in blood. We had a foretaste of what is to come in the massacre of Rodosto. Thither came hundreds of Nizamis driven from Lule Burgaz by the victorious Bulgarians. A scene of horror followed. The town was given up to massacre, outrage and pillage. It was set on fire in several places. Children were hurled into the raging flames. Many tried to get to the open sea in boats in some cases the boatmen were massacred. In others those who trusted to the sea found a merciful death beneath the waves.
