

Hooper Carries Tennessee. NASHVILLE, Tenn., Nov. 7 .- Returns from over Tennessee today make no change in the earlier indications. Governor Hooper, Republican, is assured of re-election by 5,000 over McMillin, Democrat. Figures on 50 counties in the presidential race give the following: .

Wilson 66,539; Taft 27,749; Roosevelt 21,986. Over 20 of the remaining 46 counties are Democratic. Wilson will carry the State by over 50,-000 easily, it is believed. The State Senate is claimed by the Republicans and independents. The regular Democrats apparently control the House. The situation indicates no change in the prohibition laws. The anti-Patterson men control on a joint ballot, votes on election of United States Senator against the nominee.
