REGISTRATION BOOKS WILL CLOSE NEXT THURSDAY

Chairman Hamilton C. Jones, of the county democratic executive committee calls attention to the fact that the registration books for the coming primary, to be held next Saturday, will close on Thursday of this week at sundown. So that everyone who desires to exercise the sovereign right of citizenship on next Saturday will see to it that he is properly entered on the registration books in his precinct before the close of the books next Thursday at sundown.

The hours for the primary, as fixed by the county democratic executive committee, are from 2 p. m. to 8 p. m. in Charlotte, Huntersville, Matthews, Davidson and Cornelius. At all other boxes the hour for voting will be from 2 to 6 p. m.
