Wake County Teachers' Institute at Cary.

Cary, N. C., June 19.—There is much interest in the coming Wake County Teachers' Institute, which will be held here from August 16 to September 1. This institute will be held in the Cary high school building. This school has a state-wide reputation, its farm life school being especially interesting features, surpassed by none in the state. The people of Cary expect to show the teachers of the county something interesting in educational lines when they come here for the institute.

State Shoot to Be Held at Wilmington.

Wilmington, June 19.—Dr. J. H. Dreher, secretary of the New Hanover Gun Club, under whose auspices the twelfth annual state shoot will be held here June 28th and 30th, has sent out programs of the events to be held. The Interstate Association and the New Hanover Club have admitted \$400 in cash and trophies which will be divided among those making the best showing in the contests. There will be 13 events on the first day, each being for 20 targets. On the second day there will be seven events, each for 20 targets. A special event will be the Interstate Association's Amateur State championship, for 100 single shots, 15 yards rise, high guns win. Open only to residents of North Carolina. Seven trophies will be awarded and \$50 in cash to the winner.

Proposed Extension of Norfolk-Southern.

Kinston, June 19.—Speculation as to the proposed extension of the Norfolk-Southern railroad from Snow Hill to a connection with the Raleigh division at Farmville or Stantonburg today followed the visit of prominent officials of the system to Snow Hill. President J. H. Young, chairman of Directors Marsden Perry, of New York and half a dozen others were in the party. The officials were shown through Greene county by Snow Hill men. The abandoned Great Eastern right-of-way was visited. Neither of the visitors would commit himself as to the intention of the company.

Greenville Goods Shipped to South America.

Greenville, S. C., June 19.—Goods manufactured by mills of this vicinity are being shipped to South American markets, and other mills have recently received requests for price quotations. South American Trade. A serious difficulty was encountered because of the fact that South American credit was negotiated in London, most of the big banking for the continent to the south, being done in England, France or Germany. Now, however, credit is being arranged through New York, thus effecting the first step in a development of the trade with the countries of South America.

Wilmington, June 19.—A great many complimentary remarks are being heard about the new Tidewater street cars, the first of which was put on yesterday afternoon. The cars are more roomy inside, and are much more convenient than the old ones. All the cars will now be remodeled, and repainted, making all cream-white, the color of the new cars.

Big Stone Contract Let.

Wilmington, June 19.—The contract for 13,000 tons of stone worth approximately \$40,000, has been let by the government to the Virginia Sand and Gravel Corporation, of Norfolk, according to announcement made today from the office of Maj. H. W. Stickle, U. S. district engineer.

The stone will be used in the lock and dam project at Brown's Landing. Deliveries will begin within the next few weeks, and will continue regularly until the contract has been filled.

Raleigh Free of Smallpox.

Raleigh, June 19.—With the coming of hot weather smallpox has finally been stamped out in Raleigh. During the prevalence of the epidemic in the winter and spring months, 35 persons were afflicted. In only one instance was an attack fatal, Mr. Walter Gill being the only person to die.

Although the complete records are not available, there were probably nearly 2,000 people vaccinated during the time the disease was rampant. At the city hall it was estimated that nearly a thousand treatments were given by the city. Beside these nearly all of the drug stores and all the doctors of the city were busy pushing the vaccine points and probably a thousand or more received serums by that route. The health officials of the city look hopefully to the future and do not anticipate that they will ever have to contend with near so much smallpox at one time as during the recent session. The folks who were afflicted were practically all of them unvaccinated, and these are now much fewer than ever before.

Dr. Joyner To Speak in West Virginia.

Raleigh, June 19.—Dr. J. Y. Joyner leaves today for Charleston, W. Va., where he will make an address before the West Virginia Teachers' Assembly. Dr. Joyner has just returned from Wadesboro, where he attended the meeting of the West Central Association of County Superintendents.

Sandhill Township, Moore County, Votes Road Bonds.

Aberdeen, June 19.—An election in Sandhill township, Moore county, for a \$5,000 issue of good road bonds was carried by a good majority yesterday. The law permits separate townships in Moore to vote bonds for good roads rather than the county as a whole.

This township has voted \$10,000 for good roads prior to this time and has more than 40 miles of first-class sand-clay roads.

Harrison Talks of Boys' Corn Club Work.

Washington, June 19.—Commenting on the record of Boys' Corn Clubs throughout the United States for the season of 1914 just published by the United States department of agriculture, President Harrison of Southern Railway Company said: "As in each former year since the inauguration of the Boys' Corn Clubs the championship has gone to the south, having been won by Carl Graves, at Soso, Mississippi, with the production of 292 bushels of corn on a single acre at the remarkable low cost of 14.5 cents per bushel. The highest record made by any boy outside of the south was by a Pennsylvania boy who made 148 bushels at a cost of 26.7 per bushel. This record was exceeded by ten of the first and second prize-winning boys in the south. The average yield per acre made by the winners of the first and second prizes in the states of Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Alabama, Kentucky and Tennessee was 159.26 bushels, as compared with an average of 104.22 by the prize winners in the Northern, Central and Western States. Taken into consideration with the records of previous years, these figures show that, with the adoption of proper cultural methods, the south can be made the greatest corn-producing section of the United States."

PLAN MONUMENT TO FRENCH DEAD.

Paris, June 5.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press).—The governing committee of the Republican Alliance proposes that a single design be adopted for a monument to the French dead of the European war, to be selected, reproduced and erected, in different sizes, in all the cemeteries of France. Artists and sculptors have risen up against this proposition, horrified at the monotony of a uniform design of monument in every town and village.

LLOYDS NOT HOPEFUL OF EARLY PEACE.

London, June 5.—Lloyds is apparently not hopeful of an early peace, as its members are now asking 70 per cent insurance to pay a total loss if peace is not declared by December 31st.

Auto and Motor Cycle Licenses Issued.

Raleigh, June 19.—According to information in the office of the secretary of state 4,500 automobiles and motor cycle licenses have been issued from the office during the new fiscal year. This is just about one-fourth of the number of licenses issued during the year just passed.
