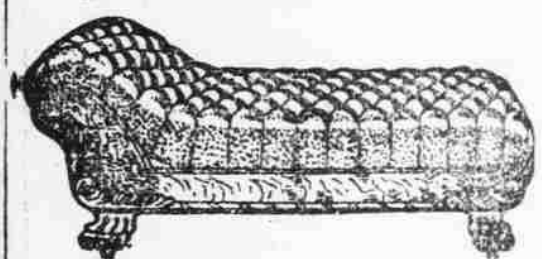

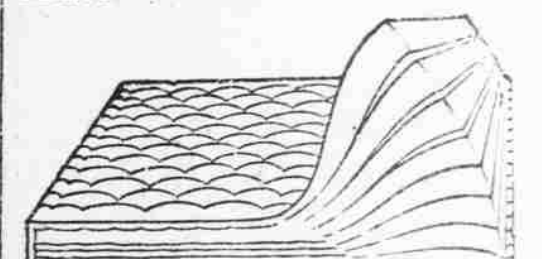

Negro Killed Near Duke.

Duke, Sept. 15.-Late Saturday afternoon Tom McCormick, a negro man, was shot and killed at the camp of the Southern Drainage and Construction Company. Eye witnesses say that David Jones, another negro did the shooting. A powerful gun was used and the ball entered one arm and passed through the body. David Jones escaped through the swamps and nothing has been seen of him since. McCormick died in a few minutes after he was shot. Both parties had gone to the camp to watch the ditching machinery and McCormick was in a buggy with two or three children, other negroes were standing around the buggy and a woman asked Tom to bring her some candy from Duke. He replied that he was afraid of David Jones. From that a few words passed between Jones and McCormick, resulting in Jones telling some one to take the children out of the buggy and ordering McCormick to take his head back in the buggy. McCormick refused until the gun was drawn. Jones stepped back a few paces and fired the fatal shot. Both men laughed for a minute until it was realized what happened. When an attempt was made to catch Jones he turned his gun on the crowd and made his way to the swamps.

Innocent Bystander Gets His.

Greensboro, Sept. 15.-Because an acquaintance borrowed his overall and jumper in which to do a day's work, Sam King, negro, started a quarrel Monday evening at a boarding house for negroes on Chestnut street that resulted in the wounding of Will Hairston and Jack Montgomery. Hairston was the negro who borrowed the jumper without telling the owner of half an outfit of overalls and when the three gathered at the house for supper, King started to tell Hairston exactly what he thought of a person who would borrow in such a manner as he did. The argument did not last long and was finally settled when King drew his revolver and fired, one shot grazing the thigh of Hairston and shattering the bone in Montgomery's right arm while the other went straight to its mark, striking Harrison near the right shoulder blade and penetrating the lung. Then King started to leave, but not before he handed the weapon to Montgomery and stated that he did not intend to shoot him, but that he intended to "get" Hairston. With the request that Montgomery would not shoot him, King beat it for the tall and uncut.

Asheville Firemen to Purchase Horse and Wagon.

Asheville, Sept. 15.-Still believing that Asheville should be ably represented at each of the state firemen's tournaments and further believing that the city cannot be ably represented unless a team with a horse and wagon go from this city, the members of the Asheville fire department have voted to raise funds with which to purchase a horse and hose wagon.

While the next state tournament will not be held until next summer and the horse and wagon will not be purchased until next spring, the firemen propose to start at once raising
