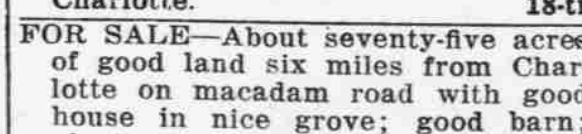

CAVALRY HELPS OUT. With the British in France, Oct. 26. Cavalry operations in conjunction with bombing airplanes is one of the war's innovations. In one case an aviator signalled that he had spotted a train bringing up German reinforcements. He made for it and dropped a bomb 200 yards ahead of the locomotive demolishing the track. Then he performed the same feat just behind the train, isolating it. The cavalry dashed up before the Germans could get away and captured every last man of them.

An officer telling of the incident remarked that it resembled an American film play with the road-agents lining up their victims against the cars with their hands high in the air.
