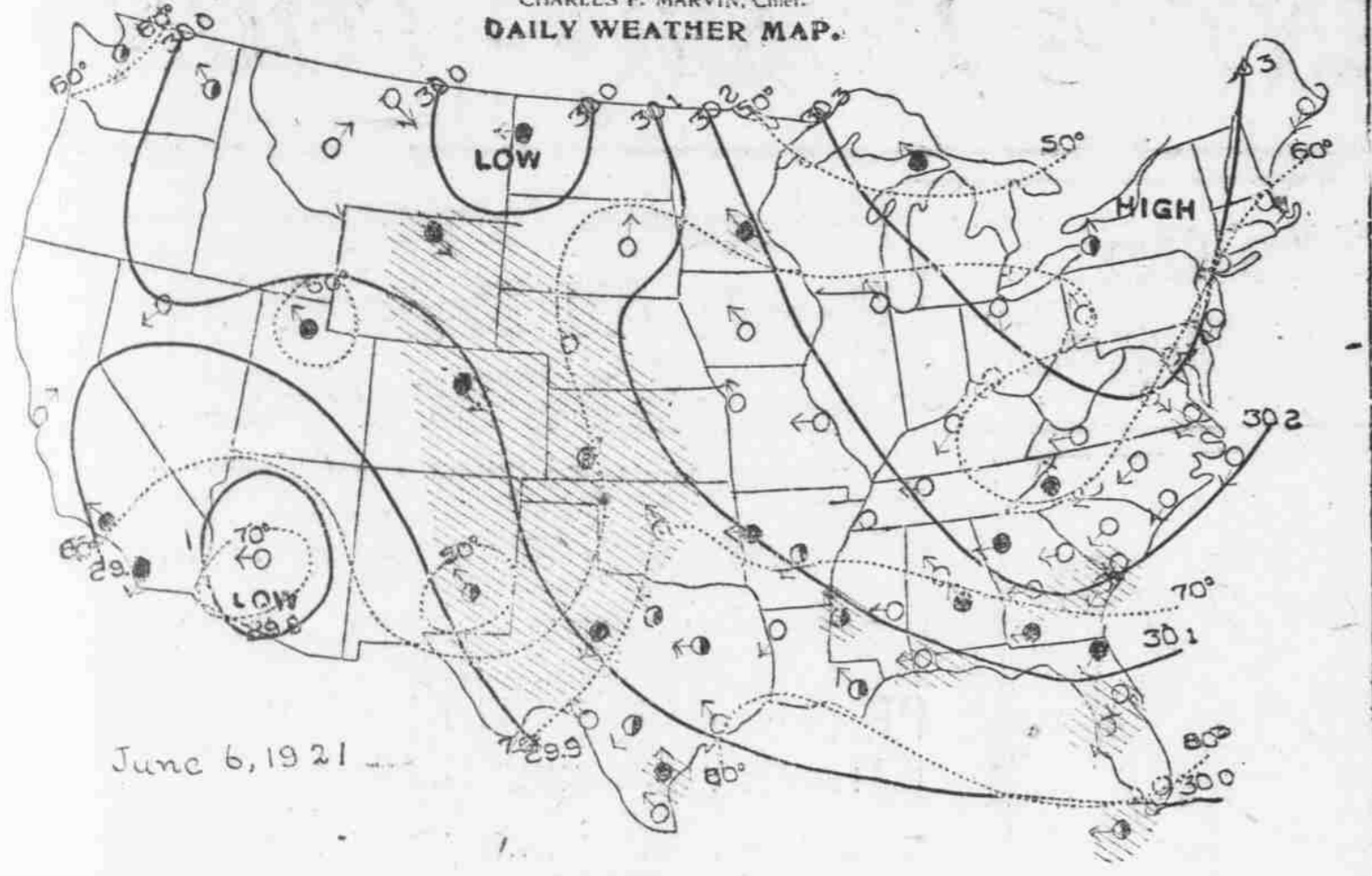

New York, June 6.—The New York Nationals, having attained their first place goal at the outset of the first western trip, are speeding at a rate that will make it difficult to overtake the advantage of playing at home the team.

The American league leadership struggle is close, because of the slow pace of the leading teams.

The Boston Nationals and the Washington Americans are looming up in the major league races but have considerable ground to make up.

In the National league, the perfect pitching of the New York staff is the outstanding feature.

With the exception of Boston, the other National teams are getting unsteady pitching.

Boston is playing good ball in spots. The Red Sox outplayed Cleveland in two of the three games of their present series after breaking even with the last place Athletics.

AMERICANS BESTED IN FOURSOMES MATCHES. Glenn Eagles, Scotland, June 6.—Great Britain won this afternoon as part of today's international match between British and American professional golf teams.

British players won three of the matches, while the Americans were unable to capture any.

and George McLean, Americans, 6 up and 5 to play. George Duncan and Abe Mitchell, Great Britain, vs. Jock Hutchinson and Walter Hagen, America, all square.
