Atlantic City, N. J., June 14.—The "no training" sign probably will remain stuck up at Jack Dempsey's camp until Thursday or Friday, according to indications today, when the world's heavyweight champion will swing back into his conditioning grind with the resumption of boxing along with the other gymnasium routine.

Manhasset, N. Y., June 14.—Georges Carpentier, when he meets Jack Dempsey July 2 expects to land the first telling punch. In a conversation today with his friend and adviser, Captain Mallet, he said that he would drop Dempsey if the latter made one single mistake.

For a time yesterday even newspaper men were barred from the camp because Dempsey suddenly developed a cough. Two correspondents managed to talk their way past the two attendants at the gate and persuaded the champion to weigh in private. He scaled exactly 198 pounds, which is six pounds above the figure he hopes to reach when he crawls through the ropes to meet Carpentier.

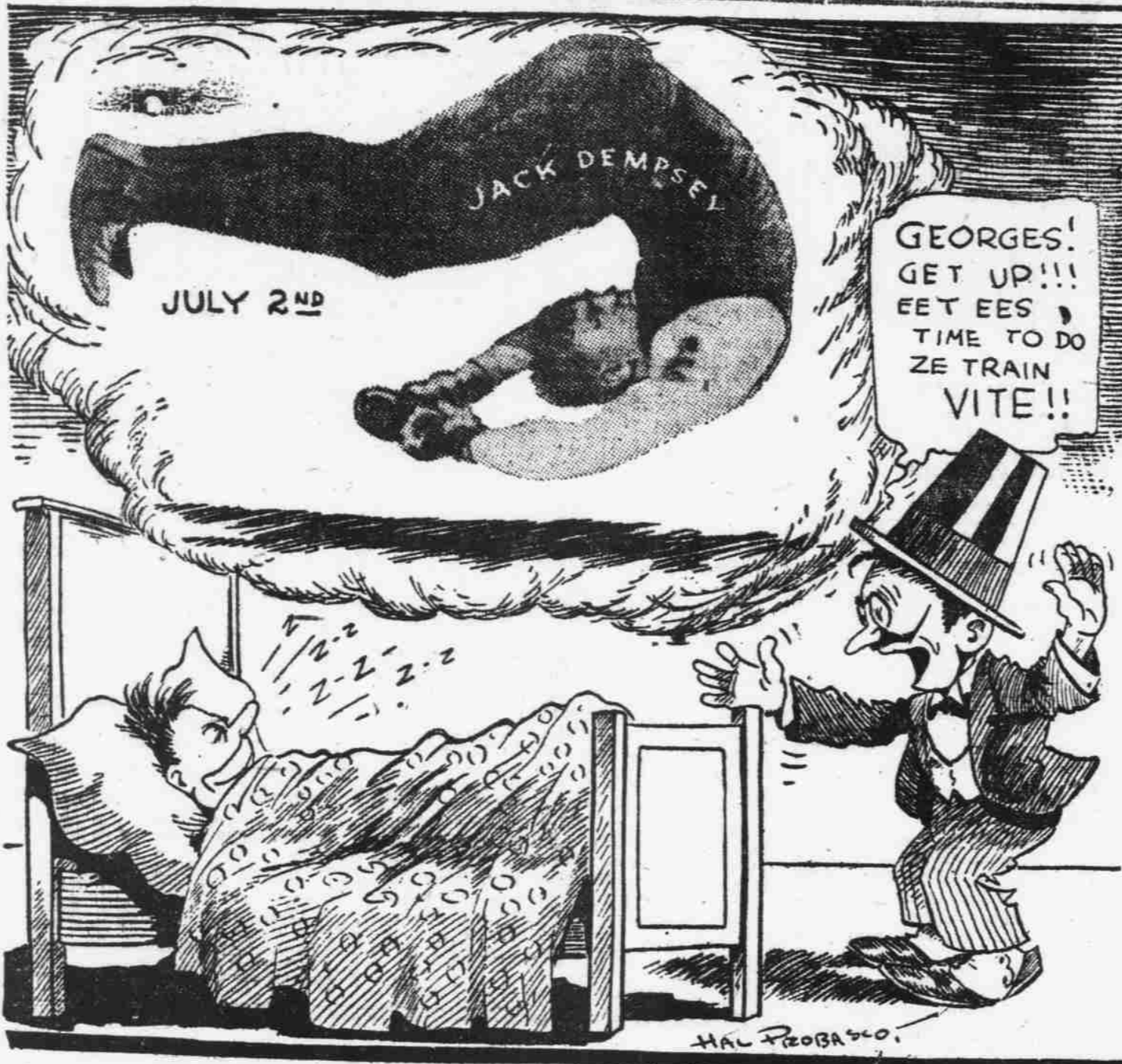

X-RAY FITTING.

London, June 14.—A novel X-ray apparatus, by which one can actually see whether new shoes fit, has been installed in a London boot-maker's shop. The purchaser of the shoes stands on the platform of the apparatus and the X-ray view of the foot and shoe is displayed to the purchaser and assistant. The apparatus is perfectly safe, as it would require exposure for a very lengthy period for the small amount of rays used to produce any ill effects.

ROAD BONDS ARE TO BE OFFERED

Council of State Authorizes Loan of \$695,000 in Addition.

Raleigh, June 14.—The council of State Monday authorized Treasurer Lacy to negotiate a loan of \$695,000 and to advertise \$5,000,000 worth of five per cent bonds and \$3,372,500 school building bonds, bids to be opened July 15.

Half million of the loan is for construction work at the University of North Carolina, \$35,000 for work at the Greensboro College for Women; \$50,000 for the Negro A and T at Greensboro and \$24,000 is to meet a judgment

against the state for tractors bought by the old highway commission. Of the bonds advertised, \$5,000,000 is for use in the construction of State highways and the remainder is to enable the state to construct school buildings in compliance with the terms of an act passed by the 1921 legislature. Half million of the five million road bonds will be offered in denominations of 100 which will place the bonds in reach of people of small means and to come, it is hoped, an encouragement to North Carolina people to absorb as many of them as possible.

RESUME RAILWAY HEARINGS

Washington, June 14.—Hearing were resumed today by the Senate interstate commerce committee in its investigation of the railway situation. The committee planned to inquire particularly into the effect of the national agreements, promulgated by the railroad administration during war time.
