CO-OPERATION IS SEEN BY MILLER

Declares Co-operative Selling Best Thing Started in South.

Co-operative selling is the biggest thing ever started among Southern farmers, according to Charles E. Miller, of the farm bureau. In the opinion of Mr. Miller, the plan is going to succeed all over the South.

"Ofing to opposition at first, it was rough going for the plan," said Mr. Miller, "but everything is running smoothly now, and in a few days I believe it will be possible to have something encouraging to give out."

Mr. Miller declared that this move is the first of its kind that has been of such wide extent. It already embraces the wheat growers of the West, the California fruit growers, and others, and the Southern farmer is ready to come in.

"Some people think that the movement is a monopoly and a trust," continued Mr. Miller, "but that is not true idea at all. Those who heard Aaron Sapiro speak here the other day, marketing know that a great part of his address was taken up in showing that the plan was to use other methods than the monopolistic. For instance, he showed that in California the first plan put into execution was to create a demand for the products of the fruit growers, and men skilled in baking sent all over the state showing the housewives how to make raisin bread and other food containing raisins."

"The plan means a big pool of cotton, of course, and even if we get no more than 20 per cent of the crop signed up under the contracts being preferred, I believe it will be sufficient to make the plan work. It will be a big fight, but I think we are going to win out."

SELL ROAD BONDS ON NEXT SATURDAY HERE

A special meeting of the board of commissioners of Mecklenburg county will be held next Saturday for the purpose of opening bids for \$500,000 of the \$2,000,000 road bonds voted by citizens of Mecklenburg county at the bond election some months ago. Chairman J. E. McLaughlin of the board issued the call for the meeting Monday afternoon.

The Mecklenburg Highway Commission expects to lend to the State Highway Commission enough of the \$500,000 to construct the first permanent highway under the new regime from Charlotte past Davidson to the Iredell county line, the Iredell county authorities and the State Highway Commission to co-operate in the same manner toward building that part of the highway that will lie in Iredell county and that will connect the Iredell with the Mecklenburg stretch of highway.

The Mecklenburg Highway Commission asked the board of commissioners some weeks ago to sell a minimum of \$500,000 of the road bonds in order that they might proceed to work as early as possible toward building highways.

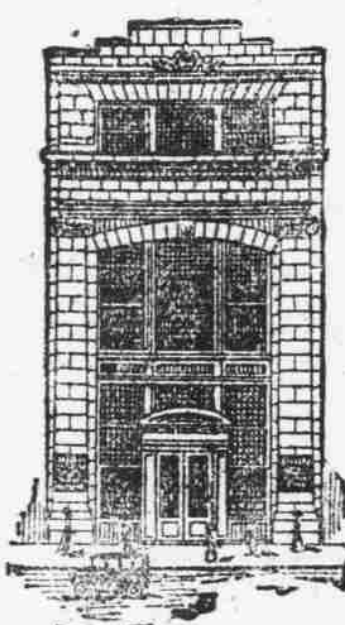

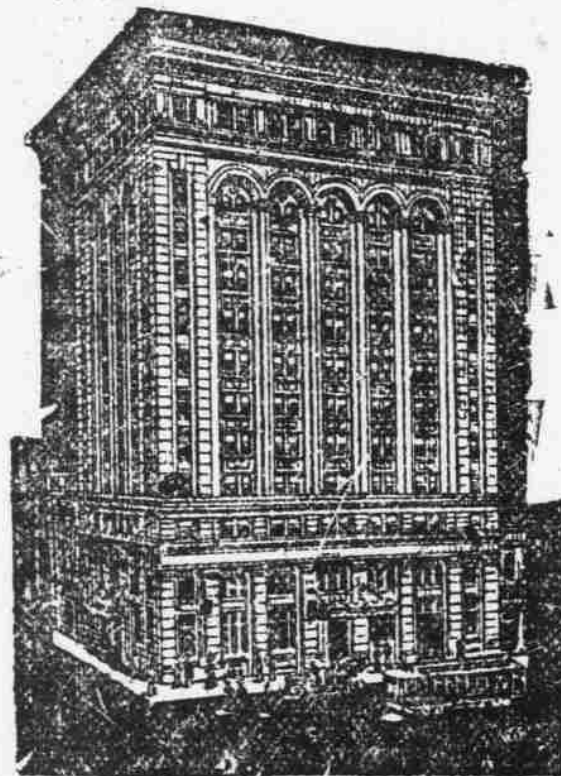

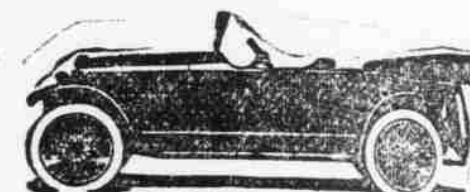
