



**WEATHER CONDITIONS.**  
 Charlotte, June 22, 1921.

The disturbance noted yesterday morning over extreme southern Texas has moved northeastward along the coast to a point between Corpus Christi and Galveston. It has increased considerably in intensity and has been attended by general rains and gales on the Texas coast. Galveston reports a maximum of 42 and Corpus Christi one of 68 miles.

Another disturbance is central over California, relative low pressure prevailing over the Lakes. It is relatively high over the south Atlantic and central Rocky Mountain states and in the extreme northwest.

Light to heavy local showers have occurred in nearly all districts of the cotton belt, except the Carolinas, eastern Georgia and greater portion of Louisiana and Mississippi, with heavy rains of 1.00 to 1.50 in. in a few scattered localities in Tennessee, Alabama, and Florida, and over 2.00 in. in eastern Texas.

Heavy rains are reported from southwestern Kansas, and light showers in the middle Mississippi and Ohio valleys, but elsewhere throughout the country far weather has prevailed.

Temperature changes have been mostly unimportant, mostly seasonal weather prevailing in the cotton district except for rather low day temperatures in Texas.

Generally fair weather with little change in temperature is indicated for this vicinity tonight and Thursday.

**THE WEATHER AND CROP CONDITIONS**

Temperature and sunshine averaged above normal during the week with local, unevenly distributed rains. Good rains occurred in some sections, probably one-third to half of the State, but in other sections rain is much needed, especially over most of the central district. Crops are generally clean. Cotton continues to show some improvement, though rather poor in many localities and generally below average. Tobacco, corn, truck, sweet potatoes and minor crops vary from poor to good, being affected partly by the local character of the rainfall. Tobacco is blooming too small in several important producing counties. Recent conditions have not been favorable over most of the wheat section and the crop is turning out poorly as harvesting proceeds, the heads not being well filled; in some sections the crop is very poor.

**PLAGUE SPREADS IN SOUTHEAST RUSSIA**

London, June 22.—A report saying that the plague is spreading rapidly throughout southeastern Russia from Persia to Siberia, was presented yesterday at the Pan-Russian Health Congress in Moscow by Health Commissioner Samasjko, says a Central News dispatch from Helmsingfors. Cholera was declared to be raging in the southern and middle provinces of Russia, and it was said there was hardly a part of Russia free from malaria.

The health commissioner attributed the spread of these diseases to enormous swarms of flies and gnats, which are carrying the maladies.
